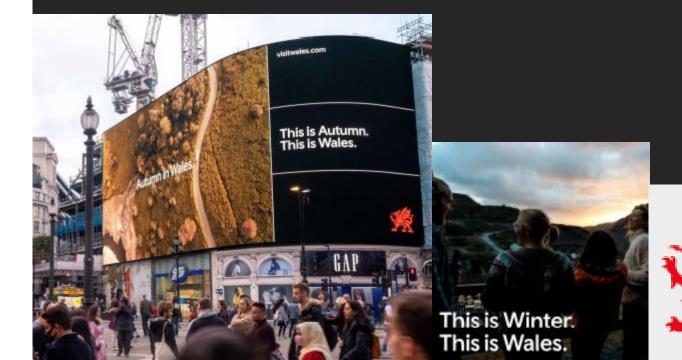
A bridge back to Strategic Plan ("Welcome to Wales: Priorities for the Visitor Economy 2020-2025")

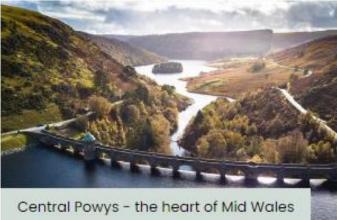

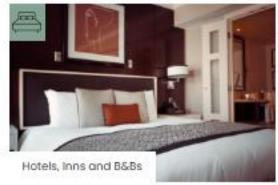
